### ...Drop in for Heritage Days Doughnuts

Bartlett History Museum (inside Village Hall, 228 S. Main St.) will be open on Heritage Days Saturday, 9/9 from 9 a.m. to noon. The museums' director will be on hand to give personal tours and share Bartlett's history along with a doughnut! At 10 a.m. or 11 a.m., you can learn about the 125-year history of Bartlett Cemetery through a short presentation and original documents and images. Admission is always free.

## ZONED FOR BUSINESS

## METRA Parking Made Easier



A new mobile pay app plus a parking lot reconfiguration will equal a faster, easier and more efficient commute for Bartlett METRA riders.

### Passport Mobile App

The Village is working with Passport Parking Inc. to allow commuters to pay for their parking spaces using their cell phone. Riders can pay each time they park or pay through Virtual Wallet. Sign-up is user-friendly via email, phone number or Facebook. The cost to daily commuters is an additional \$0.32 and for permit parkers, the cost is an additional \$1.00 per quarter. The traditional form of payment will still be available.

### Increased Permit Parking

Another change that is being made is a reconfiguration of the parking lots to increase permit parking. The Village is adding 283 permit parking spots for a new total of 401 permit spaces.

This new configuration will help eliminate waiting lists for parking permits and increase options for residents. Permanent spots will be located all along the rail and not just in one lot. The permit spaces will not be numbered and permit holders can park in any of the permit spaces. For more information about purchasing a quarterly parking permit, call Village Hall, 630-837-0800.

The METRA parking improvements are expected by early September. Village employees will be located in the parking lots during the first week of implementation to help with the transition.

# A Minute with the Mayor

On June 24, the Village had a ceremonial groundbreaking for the new Bartlett police headquarters and construction began just a couple of weeks after that. Frederick Quinn Corporation (FQC) is the construction manager for the project, which is expected to last through the fall of 2018.



The expansion consists of building onto the northern part of the current police facility with a basement and two levels above grade. During construction, operations will be maintained in the current building. When the addition is completed, department staff will move to the new building, and the older structure will be renovated as necessary.

The new building will be almost double the size of the existing 22,000 square foot building and will meet the modern technology, equipment and systems requirements of our police department.

While work is underway on the new building, I'll be looking forward to a few more opportunities to play before the seasons change.

Look for me at Bartlett Heritage Days, which happens in our downtown on Saturday, 9/9 and Sunday, 9/10. This will be the eighth year that the Heritage Days organization is helping us end the summer with a "get together for old times' sake," and we can't thank them enough.

A few weeks after that, on Sunday, 10/1, my family and I will be riding in the second annual Kickstand Classic. Last year, our first time partnering with Active Transportation Alliance for this fun bike challenge, we drew more than 400 cyclists to downtown Bartlett.

Not only is this event a great opportunity for riders of all skill levels to test their speed or just enjoy a Sunday ride on a car-free course, but it is also a good way for the Village to show its support for all the bicyclists in our community.

The proceeds raised from the Kickstand Classic benefit the nonprofit Active Transportation Alliance and its efforts to make bicycling safer and more convenient throughout the Chicagoland region. I think that is a goal that Bartlett can cheer and applaud along with the winners of this year's challenge.

# POLICE BEAT



## Increasing Speed Awareness

Bartlett Police Department will utilize four new traffic calming devices at the start of the 2017-2018 school year. These devices consist of two solar-powered school speed limit blinker signs that will be installed on Westridge Boulevard near Nature Ridge School and two portable driver feedback signs. These devices are designed to increase driver speed awareness and roadway safety around schools and in residential neighborhoods.

August 16 is the first day of classes for U-46 students. Drivers are reminded to obey school speed zone signs, refrain from using their cell phones and pay extra attention to students walking to and from school.

## Paws on Patrol

Do you regularly walk your dog? If the answer is yes, then Bartlett's new Dog Walker Watch, "Paws on Patrol," wants you! Be a part of the Dog Walker Watch crime awareness program that enlists dog owners to serve as extra eyes and ears for law enforcement.

### What Is Dog Walker Watch?

The Dog Walker Watch crime awareness program is designed for neighbors who are familiar with their community and out in the neighborhood on a regular basis anyway, whether walking with or without a dog. Unlike a community watch program, Dog Walker Watch requires no time commitment beyond an individual's regular routine.

## How Dog Walker Watch Works

This program trains you to effectively observe and report criminal activity as you are routinely out in your neighborhood. Those who know the neighborhood best (you) now become more aware and less hesitant to report suspicious activity, such as:

- ~ Unusual behavior: looking into cars, canvassing, walking towards the rear of properties or looking into mailboxes
- ~ A vehicle parked in an unusual location or an unoccupied vehicle that may not belong
- ~ A vehicle cruising the neighborhood at slow speeds
- ~ Apparent business transactions occurring from vehicles
- ~ School age children walking around neighborhoods during school hours
- ~ People not dressed for the weather conditions (long sleeve shirts, gloves, or hoodies in the middle of summer)
- ~ Individuals knocking on doors asking questions that do not make sense
- ~ Persons carrying large items, such as TVs, microwaves, computers, etc. down the road or sidewalks

# Kickstand CLASSIC

The 2nd annual Kickstand Classic will take place on Sunday, 10/1, and yet again, no spandex required! Racers are electronically timed and grouped with people of similar abilities on a car-free course in downtown Bartlett. Everyone is welcome!

You start and end on Main Street, riding two, three or four laps (you choose) around the 4.8 mile race loop. Ride as fast as you can for this 10, 14.5 or 19-mile race or choose a calmer pace. A rest and water stop is available at Leiseberg Park on the north side of the route.

## START TIMES

Start in waves with people of similar biking speeds. Each wave will also have a slow released start. Your timing chip will record your individual start and finish times, as well as your lap pace.

**Speed Demon Wave powered by SRAM:** 6:30 to 6:45 a.m. (drafting permitted in this wave only)

**Middle of the Road Wave:** 7:45 to 8 a.m.

**Sunday Funday Wave:** 9:30 to 9:50 a.m. \*\* All Sunday Funday participants have to finish course by 11:45 a.m. in order to reintroduce traffic to main streets.\*\*

**Packet Pick Up:** PPU will open at 5 a.m. on the day of the event. Due to the three waves, there will be plenty of time for people to pick up their number and timing device at the start line. Remember it's a slow released start, and riders will go in several groups to ensure safety.

## REGISTRATION

Register at [kickstandclassic.org](http://kickstandclassic.org). Registration includes a commemorative cotton tee shirt, on-course technical bike support, a rest stop with light snacks and water, age group awards (**riders must participate in the 19-mile course to be eligible for awards**) and access to a post ride festival featuring a free beer by Revolution Brewing, entertainment and more.

Proceeds benefit the nonprofit Active Transportation Alliance. Active Trans is a coalition of people who are working to make biking, walking and transit safe and easy options for getting around Chicagoland.

# Fall 2017 Parkway Tree Replacement Program



Through its long-running Parkway Tree Program, the Village of Bartlett has shared the cost of planting trees with homeowners in an effort to reforest Bartlett's parkways. This program has been accelerated in recent years due to the devastation caused by the emerald ash borer infestation in Illinois. The Village continues its commitment to reforestation and diversification by offering a large number of tree species again this year.

All trees available for order are 2 inches in diameter, at a cost of only \$50 per tree. Due to the fixed number of trees, orders will be filled on a first come, first serve basis. If the tree you order sells out, you will be contacted to make another selection.

You are only eligible to purchase a tree if you had a tree removed from your parkway or have the space for one to be planted. Trees must be spaced 30 to 40 feet apart. Other restrictions, such as proximity to street lights, hydrants, storm sewers, etc. may occur. Planting locations will be determined by the Village.

Public Works will begin taking orders August 21 for the fall planting season. Visit the Public Works page on the Village website, [www.village.bartlett.il.us](http://www.village.bartlett.il.us), to see photos of the trees available or call Public Works, 630-837-0811, for more information. Orders, with checks

made payable to the Village of Bartlett, must be received by October 20. Please mail orders to: Parkway Tree Program, Bartlett Public Works, 1150 Bittersweet Dr, Bartlett, IL 60103.

**In 2018, the Village will be returning to a 50/50 cost share program with residents for parkway trees. Therefore, this is the last opportunity to purchase a replacement tree for only \$50.,**

...that Bartlett's Village Board recently approved a Complete Streets Policy, which changes the focus for community roadways from "cars first to people first - safely," no matter the mode of transportation.

The Complete Streets Policy incorporates the needs of all users when the Village plans, designs, approves and implements future roadway and transportation projects, including construction, pavement resurfacing, restriping and signal projects.

Drivers, bicyclists and pedestrians are all responsible for following traffic rules and for safely sharing roadways. The Complete Streets Policy is an affirmation of Bartlett's commitment to safe and comfortable travel for all roadway users.
