In the 1950s, comedienne Lucille Ball captured the hearts of television audiences across the nation, including Bartlett. Her wacky hijinks and fearless enthusiasm kept thousands laughing. Off-screen, she and her real-life husband, Desi Arnaz, launched their own television studio and pioneered new technologies. But what does it mean when an onscreen legend clashes with her offscreen reality.

New Dog Registration Portal



Bartlett residents can now enter their dogs directly into the police department's "Pet Management" portal. This information can be used by police to reunite dogs with their owners in the event they go missing or are reported stolen.

As a reminder for registering your dog:

- Used to assist police when lost or stolen dogs are located
- Please enter as much identifying information as possible into the Pet Management portal and/or include a photograph of your dog
- Ensuring your dogs are microchipped greatly assists police with returning dogs to their owners
- The website is not monitored for new entries, so please contact Bartlett Police or 911 if your dog is missing or you locate a stray dog

Correction

In the January 15 issue of Trending Now, under the section titled "New State Laws for 2025," the text following "Fentanyl Test Strips" incorrectly stated that "law enforcement, fire departments, and health care facilities must have fentanyl test strips on hand and offer them to the public for free."

Although that requirement was part of Senate Bill 3350 as originally introduced, a subsequent amendment to the legislation removed "the provision requiring every law enforcement agency and fire department that responds to emergency medical calls to possess fentanyl test strips and to distribute fentanyl test strips to the public at no charge."

The legislation, effective January 1, 2025, continues to provide that the Illinois Department of Human Services may establish or authorize a program for dispensing and distributing fentanyl test strips. Provides that the department may acquire fentanyl test strips, train individuals in the use of fentanyl test strips and distribute fentanyl test strips. Provides that the department may award grants for the purchasing and distributing of fentanyl test strips.
