Make sure you're prepared for severe weather and possible outages by signing up for Outage Alerts today.

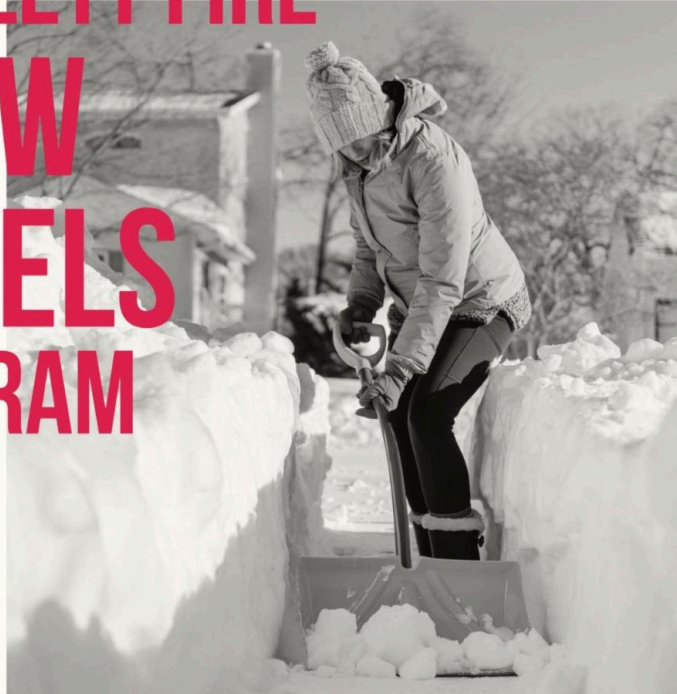
- Text "ADD OUTAGE" to 26633 and you will instantly receive a text message confirming your enrollment
- Once enrolled, you will automatically receive a text message notifying you when an outage is known
- Typically, a notice is sent within 30 minutes of a confirmed outage
- Use ComEd's outage tracker to track estimated restoration time of an outage within the mobile app or online

BARTLETT FIRE SNOW ANGELS PROGRAM



Bartlett Fire Protection District has launched a district-led volunteer initiative to assist neighbors in need in the community during the winter months. Volunteers in this program help to shovel snow and salt sidewalks and walkways for older residents and those with physical disabilities who may not be able to shovel or salt themselves.

Not only is this winter program designed to make sidewalks safer, but it also works to build stronger relationships between neighbors and foster a sense of community among fire district residents. Cleared sidewalks mean safer walking conditions for all members of the community, not just your neighbor requesting assistance. Postal carriers, delivery drivers, firefighters, police officers, children walking to school, and neighbors walking their pets can all benefit from cleared sidewalks.
